Some thoughts from Liz Lloyd, Herefordshire Rural Hub Chair

'Every child loves being on a farm and summer is a time of great opportunity for fun. But children's natural curiosity and fascination with tractors, telehandlers and

combines carries potential dangers. Carefully evaluate risks around vulnerable aspects such as machinery, livestock, slurry pits and grain silos. Do set aside an area where young children can play safely. You need to make sure that older ones who might be keen to help - and you - really understand the vital importance of farm safety. Making a few simple checks could actually save a life. There's practical information on staying safe on farms at Yellow Wellies, the charity behind Farm Safety Week. Prolonged dry weather respond to Severn Trent - livestock farmers in the Severn Trent Water catchment are being asked to prepare for prolonged dry weather by completing a Site Risk and Sensitive Scheme form. With the information provided, Severn Trent will be able to keep those with livestock better informed of problems and in times of water supply interruption the ability to act quicker, by either fixing the problem or providing an alternative water source. <https://www.stwater.co.uk/get-in-touch/site-risk-and-sensitivities-scheme--srss--application/> SPID number - You generally have 2 Supply Point Identifier (SPID) numbers, one for water connection and the other for sewage connection. It is a 10-digit number followed by a letter and then two more digits - 0000000000W00. You should find it on the latest invoice from your water retailer.

Lump Sum Exit Scheme

DEFRA's Lump Sum Exit Scheme is open for applications until the end of September 2022. You can [find out more about the scheme on GOV.UK](#). DEFRA will issue further guidance when the scheme is opened.

Calculate Progressive Reductions going forward for BPS:

The [calculator](#) will apply progressive reductions to a 'starting payment amount' for the scheme years 2021 to 2024.

Adverse weather and agri-environment schemes

If you have an agri-environment agreement and you cannot meet the agreement requirements due to adverse weather conditions, you must contact the RPA (Rural Payments Agency).

The RPA will review each individual agreement holder's circumstances on a case by case basis.

Slurry Infrastructure Grant

This grant is competitive. The Rural Payments Agency (RPA) will give the grant to those applications that best fit funding priorities.

Livestock Information Service open for reporting movements for Sheep, Goats & Deer

The first reporting service to move from ARAMS to LIS is open now for sheep, goats and deer.

Delay to changes for Reducing Ammonia emissions from Urea Fertilisers

The proposed alternative approach to the use of [urea fertiliser](#) will be delivered through the Red Tractor farm assurance scheme and FACTS advisers **from 2023**, delaying the planned changes by at least a year to help farmers manage costs and give more time to adapt to pressures on the supply of ammonium nitrate fertilisers.

Food, Farming and Countryside Commission: Scrutinising assumptions

Animal transport authorisations

If you move animals more than 65km as part of your business activity or for trade you must have a transport authorisation issued by APHA (Animal and Plant Health Agency). Animal transport authorisations last for five years. A significant number are due for renewal in 2022. The APHA is reminding transporters to apply for renewal as early as possible before their current authorisation expires to ensure you can continue to operate. It will not cost you anything to renew your authorisation but transporting animals without the correct authorisation carries heavy penalties.

Animal gathering licences

If you want to hold an animal gathering, the premises must have an [Animal Gatherings Order \(AGO\) licence](#) from Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA).

An animal gathering is when certain species of animals (see below) are brought together from different places:

- to be sold
- to be sent elsewhere (for example, for slaughter)
- for show or exhibition
- to be inspected for breed characteristics (for example, to assess pedigree status)

The animal species include:

- cattle (excluding bison and yak)
- sheep
- pigs
- deer
- goats

Gatherings of poultry and other captive birds are not licensed in the same way but must be registered. See the [bird gathering general licence](#). You must have an animal gathering licence if your gathering involves poultry/captive birds and any of the animals listed above.

The impact of the hot weather is near to reaching lethal levels in the Wye. Temperatures in the Lower Wye were >23 degrees on Wednesday and if the forecast for next week is correct temperatures are likely to be even higher. In the drought of 1976 the Wye reached 27degrees and resulted in a massive fish kill.

We have the majority of this year's Wye salmon run still stuck below Ross due to the low flows. Many pools have hundreds of fish in them.

We have negotiated with Welsh Water to enact their 'spate clause' and they have agreed to release additional water over the weekend which we hope will prevent the river reaching lethal temperatures and avoid a fish kill.

We appreciate that abstraction during such hot dry conditions is sustaining crops but we hope that the potential impact of these weather conditions on our wildlife is understood too. We are asking abstractors to halt where possible or limit if not, their water take from the Wye on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday to ensure this release of water reaches the fish it is intended for...

If you are an abstractor please do let me know your thoughts on the above and any decision you subsequently make.

Please share this request with any neighbours/friends that may be abstracting so that it reaches as many people as possible.

Paper £20 and £50 note withdrawal

The Bank of England will withdraw legal tender status of **paper** £20 and £50 notes after 30th September 2022. Details [here](#).

Any paper £20 or £50 notes should be used or deposited at bank or Post Office before 30th September 2022. After 30th September, only polymer notes will have legal tender status. After this date, many UK banks will accept withdrawn notes as deposits from customers. Some Post Offices may also accept withdrawn notes as a deposit into any bank account that can be accessed with them. The Bank of England will always exchange any withdrawn notes, including paper notes that have been withdrawn in the past
