

Meeting of Traffic Management Steering Group

Date: Monday 3rd October 2022

- Bredenbury Planters. We have met with Fiona Miles from BBLP regarding the planters and cultivation licences. Going out of the village towards Bromyard the right hand side of the road is not suitable as there is a ditch in the verge. On the opposite side of the road beneath the 40mph sign could be a possibility. However, the sign needs to be cleared and the hedge cut back. There may be services there so Fiona will check with Cadent and let us know.
- There is concern regarding the turn off the A44 towards Noakes Riding Stables and the number of accidents and near misses. John Harrington requested that Simon Hobbs looked at the site and he was concerned about the width of the hedge which is about 4ft from the original fence line. This is owned by Hereford Nature Trust and they are to be contacted.
- As a result of a letter to the West Mercia Police Commissioner, John Hulse and Vicky Hancock met with assistant Police Commissioner Paul Middlebrough to discuss the issues regarding safety in the village and also the work the TMG have been doing (he was impressed). He could see the issue regarding the width of the pavements, the volume of traffic etc. He really listened to the concerns and asked for notes from the meeting and would be back in touch with us. He did hint there may be some grant funding available for the group to address some of the issues. We will wait to hear.
- There were suggestions for bulb planting on the verges and also to plant wildflower seeds on the wide verge opposite the Three Pines. Yellow rattle was noted as a possibility to suppress the grass.

Decisions: to find out about yellow rattle/bulbs/wildflower seed.

To bring up once more the wide verge and how it is difficult to cut back the hedge because of the drainage channels. To speak to John Harrington.
